




Question: How satisfied are you with the functioning of democracy in Poland?


Description of Poland by its inhabitants


Poland, Czechia and Slovakia in Comparison



The Plausibility of Disinformation

42 % of Poles consider the most plausible the news about the hit of the ammunition depot in Ukraine and the accredited laboratory in Hungary. Poles are more inclined to believe news about Ukraine war which are in favor of Ukraine.

ABOUT THE SURVEY

Research goal: The aim of the research, carried out in Poland in cooperation with the Central European Digital Media Observatory (CEDMO) research consortium and SWPS University, was to determine satisfaction withdemocracy in this country, opinions on Russia's disinformation war and the ability to detect disinformation or the consequences of the Ukrainian refugee crisis. Similar surveys have been conducted in Czechia and Slovakia as well.

Data Collection Method: CASI method using online panel Ipsos Interactive Services Poland.

<u>Target group:</u> Representative sample of the population of Poland over 18 years (quota selection by gender, age, region)

Total n = 1001

Research tool: Structured questionnaire of up to 10 minutes.

Data collection period: Data collection was carried out from 17 July to 25 July 2023.
